NCRS Region IX Director and President: Mike Ingham

Mike held a bi-monthly meeting with Region IX Chapter Chairs. Chapter officers are concerned about the lack of general member participation. Accordingly, they are hoping to incorporate more social activities to get more member involvement. Mike pointed out a lack of Regional Meets between the January event in Florida and the June event in Altoona, PA in 2026, and is encouraging Region IX Chapters to consider scheduling events in that window. Revised Regional event guidelines will be distributed to the Chapters.

Old Business:

There was a discussion about visiting the California Automobile Museum, the Blackhawk Museum, and Canepa Motorsports. Rick Gower commented that Canepa has an interesting posting about restoring a 1921 Duesenberg.

Technical Discussion Board: Rick Gower As always, Rick had interesting tidbits from the NCRS Discussion Board. These include how to get key codes for lost 1970 keys, Corey Peterson's video of the 1953 Car 001, lots of '67s that will be judged at the National Convention, and he cautioned about sales that look too good to be true. Rick announced that a previous Chapter member and car collector, Rich Mason, recently passed away.

Show and Tell:

Mike Ingham described working on the AC system in Sharyl's '69 that does not work. He replaced the R12 refrigerant with 134A. He got several suggestions about dryers, evaporators, oil pressure, seals and hoses, and contaminates.

Slide Show:

Jeff has requested that anyone who has a series of pictures contact him and display a slide show at a future meeting. Since Jeff has yet to get a response, he showed detailed pictures of the heater box from his '63 restoration. The extensive fiberglass repair technique matches the original texture and color. The process could be done on other interior parts.

The next Zoom meeting will be <u>August 20</u> (the third Tuesday due to a conflict that Jeff has) at 7:00 pm.

Identifying a Wide- vs Close-Ratio Transmission

It seems that people are always wondering what ratio their transmission is. Here are a few ways to determine whether you have a wide or close ratio transmission.

For any transmission, if it is not installed. Put the transmission in first gear. Carefully mark the input and output shaft splines. Rotate the input shaft until the output shaft has rotated 1 turn. Count the number of input shaft revolutions. If it is 2 ¹/₄: close ratio; 2 ¹/₂: wide ratio. For a Muncie 318 3-speed, 2 ¹/₄: close ratio; 3: wide ratio from a passenger car.

For a T-10:

Remove the transmission side cover (9 bolts). Count the number of teeth on the main drive gear (AKA clutch gear or input shaft). All BW T-10 close ratio (2.20) had 27 teeth. All BW T-10 wide ratio (2.54) had 25 teeth.

For any 4-speed transmission that is installed:

Drive in 3rd gear at 3000 RPM and note the road speed. Shift into 4th gear; re-establish the road speed. What is the RPM in 4th gear? 3000 RPM drops to 1987 RPM (3000/1.51 = 1987) = Wide Ratio 3000 RPM drops to 2290 RPM (3000/1.31 = 2290) = Close Ratio.

Drive the car in 4th gear with the tach reading exactly 1000 RPM and note the vehicle speed. Shift into 1st gear and return to the previously noted vehicle speed. Now note the tach reading. If the tach reads 2200 RPM, the transmission is a close ratio. If the tach reads 2520 or 2540 RPM, it's a wide ratio.

For any C1 3-speed SM318 transmission that is installed, it is similar to a 4-speed:

Drive in 2nd gear at 3000 RPM and note the road speed. Shift into 3rd gear; re-establish the road speed. What is the RPM in 3rd gear? 3000 RPM drops to 1800 RPM (3000/1.67 = 1800) = Wide Ratio (passenger car) 3000 RPM drops to 2290 RPM (3000/1.31 = 2290) = Close Ratio.

Drive the car in 3rd gear with the tach reading exactly 1000 RPM and note the vehicle speed. Shift into 1st gear and return to the previously noted vehicle speed. Now note the tach reading. If the tach reads 2200 RPM, the transmission is a close ratio. If the tach reads 2940 RPM, it's a wide ratio.
