C4 A/C Restoration

Before doing anything, I sketched out a plan. My thoughts were, I've never done any A/C work, but how difficult can it be. I'll locate a shop that has good reviews and has been doing rebuilds forever. Ship the compressor

The first three months were spent trying to locate anyone that still rebuilds A/C compressors. I couldn't find anyone to rebuild the A/C compressor. Now I had a dilemma. I could go out and purchase a new compressor that's compatible with the modern-day refrigerant, plus hoses, accumulator, and refrigerant for around \$800. The downside would be the next time the car gets judged at an NCRS event I'd get hit with a 32-point deduction.

That was enough to sway my decision of what to do next. It was time to learn everything I could about the A/C system. My reason for the complete breakdown and rebuild of the compressor was it was leaking oil and the system was not blowing cold air.

My next step was to order all the parts and tools needed to complete the rebuild along with an extra compressor to practice on. The original 4-6 week estimate was delusional; it took six months to complete. I highly recommend that if you're going to take on a project similar to this project pick up a GM service manual and a GM shop manual specific to your car. The manuals I used were ST-387-86 and ST-364-86.

A breakdown of everything I purchased to accomplish the A/C rebuild with prices that include shipping and taxes follows:

GM R4 A/C Compressor Service Tool Kit.

\$277.03 Kent Moore A/C holding fixture tool. \$146.62 Removal Tool 59581. \$40.42 A/C Compressor to practice on. \$89.95 A/C Hose GM 14081324 & 14081325. \$237.04 A/C Accumulator, Dehyd 2724288. \$53.03

R-12 Oil \$15.42

\$29.60

\$28.61

GM R4 A/C Compressor Reseal Kit.

AC Delco PAG 150 Refrigerator Oil.

3-12oz R-12 Freon

\$154.35


Tire Mart vacuumed, charged and tested the \$300.00 system.

Total cost to rebuild the compressor, purchase tools and parts, and recharge the A/C.

\$1372.07

The project turned out to be a good learning experience and satisfying for me. The car is still blowing cold air 33 months later and no longer leaks oil. Thankfully the project was a success. I received the NCRS Performance Verification at the Northwest Regional in Redmond, Oregon in August 2022.

The following pictures are a brief representation of the project. Get yourself a shop manual, the correct tools, and good luck.
